The Texas High School Project is a unique public-private alliance dedicated to significantly improving the postsecondary readiness of low-income students with a focus on students in low-performing schools.



- THSP is serving more than 84,000 students across Texas.
- THSP has allocated more than \$375 million to ensure that all Texas students are postsecondary ready.
- THSP works to support 49 Early College High Schools and 54 Texas Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (T-STEM) Academies.
- THSP has developed school models that exhibit Accountability Ratings and Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS) scores that are higher than the state average.

THSP develops practical insights and proven solutions that can be scaled in schools and districts throughout Texas based on our evidence and data analysis across the transition from middle school (8-9) through high school (9-12) and into postsecondary programs (four-year, two-year and technical programs).
